2009 Albany/Capital District APICS Scholarship

For the fifth consecutive year, the Albany/Capital District chapter of APICS will be awarding two \$1,000.00 scholarships, to be presented at its annual awards dinner the evening of Wednesday, May 13, 2009. Beginning this year, scholarship eligibility has been expanded to include the general public.

To be eligible for the scholarship program, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- 1. The applicant must be a resident of the Capital District
- 2. The applicant must be a high school senior graduating in 2009 or a current full-time college student
- 3. The applicant must be accepted at or currently enrolled in an accredited two or four year college or university

Completed applications must be returned with a postmark of no later than April 12, 2009 and include the following:

- A letter of recommendation by a teacher/counselor from the applicant's school.
- An official transcript (and SAT scores if currently in HS)
- An essay of 300-500 words on the topic of "The current and future roles of Operations Management."
