

As Senior Vice President of Programs, David Rooney is a member of CEG's senior leadership team managing programs directed at preparing Tech Valley for technology-based growth. CSCP (Certified Supply Chain Professional)

The CSCP designation is for professionals who are interested in increasing their knowledge and expertise in the field of supply chain management. This designation is ideal for you and your organization if you are interested in more depth of knowledge and understanding in the areas of supplier and customer relations, international trade, the use of information technology to enable the supply chain, and physical logistics. CSCP will help you advance your career while giving you the foundation to improve your company's competitive position and profitability.

Minimum class size is 5 students and is subject to cancellation. Course fee is \$2,000 which includes the course participant books. Pre-registration and a deposit of \$500 will be required 2 weeks before the start of the first class.

<u>CPIM (Certified in Production & Inventory Mgt)</u>

The Certified in Production & Inventory Management program is a cost effective and widely recognized professional education program. The five modules are: Basics of Supply Chain Management, Master Planning of Resources, Detailed Scheduling and Planning, Execution and Control of Operations, and Strategic Management of Resources. The course schedule provides the opportunity for long term career planning and successful program completion.

Course Fees per student: APICS members \$350, non-members \$400. Minimum class size is 6 students and is subject to cancellation. Early reservations are appreciated.

Introduction to ERP

The Introduction to Enterprise Resources Planning (ERP) course will help you determine if your organization is ready for an ERP implementation, examine the benefits of implementing an ERP system, and build a compelling business case in support of an ERP implementation. Introduction to ERP explores the process integration of businesswide functions (demand management, product design, and delivery) required and supported by an ERP implementation.

The course also addresses tactical functions required, such as project management and project planning, provides an overview of implementation alternatives for ERP, and includes a manufacturing case study.



Course Learning Objectives

- Describe the concept of ERP and the ERP model; define key terms; explain the transition from MRP to ERP; identify the levels of ERP maturity.
- Explain how ERP is used to integrate business processes; define and analyze a process; create a process map and improve and/or simplify the process; apply the result to an ERP implementation.
- Identify the international issues that impact a worldwide implementation of ERP; identify the key technological considerations and infrastructure concerns in ERP implementation; describe the strategic use of technology for ERP.
- Explain how the key elements of organizational change management apply to an ERP
 implementation; define change readiness; describe a learning requirements plan; explain the use of
 assessment tools to identify the readiness of an organization to change; identify the methods of
 implementing and sustaining the change.
- Describe project organizational considerations; define the project management tools and resources needed to implement an ERP system; describe the roles and responsibilities of the key organization players; describe the tactics, tools, and methodologies available to implement ERP; evaluate the success of the implementation.
- Describe how the knowledge management capability of an ERP system can be used to sustain competitive advantage; describe how to use ERP to communicate effectively with customers and suppliers.

Fundamentals of Materials and Operations Management

The Fundamentals of Materials and Operations Management Education program offers an exciting classroom based instructor-led educational opportunity for people new to materials and management operations as well as those working the positions that interact with this field. The material is divided into a four module format of course teaching the basic concepts, techniques, and terminology. The four modules are: Fundamentals of Operations and Manufacturing, Fundamentals of Manufacturing Control, Fundamentals of Planning, and Fundamentals of Inventory Control.

Minimum class size is 6 students and is subject to cancellation. Early reservations are appreciated.
