

2011 Albany/Capital District APICS Scholarship

For the seventh consecutive year, the Albany/Capital District chapter of APICS will be awarding two \$1,000.00 scholarships, to be presented at its annual awards dinner the evening of Wednesday, May 11, 2011. Beginning in 2009, scholarship eligibility was expanded to include the general public.

To be eligible for the scholarship program, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- 1. The applicant must be a resident of the Capital District
- 2. The applicant must be a high school senior graduating in 2011 or a current full-time college student
- 3. The applicant must be accepted at or currently enrolled in an accredited two or four year college or university

Completed applications must be returned with a postmark of no later than April 12, 2011 and include the following:

- A letter of recommendation by a teacher/counselor from the applicant's school.
- An official transcript (and SAT scores if currently in HS)
- An essay of 300-500 words on the topic of "The current and future roles of Operations Management."

Chapter Earns Gold/Platinum Ranking

The Albany/Capital District Chapter of APICS has earned a Gold ranking for the 2009-2010 year as part of the APICS C-BAR (Chapter Benchmarking and Reporting) process. Among other things, the C-BAR program is designed to recognize chapters that meet or exceed the set of activities recommended for a successful chapter. The Gold ranking is the highest yearly ranking awarded in the C-BAR program, and is reserved for chapters that perform well above the minimum standards. In order to qualify for the Platinum ranking, chapters must earn a Gold ranking for five consecutive years.



College Credit for CPIM and CSCP Exams

On September 21st, the National Program on Non-collegiate Sponsored Instruction (PONSI) awarded college credit recommendations for APICS exams. This is very important both for college credit and for individuals seeking employer support/funding for their certification expenses.

- CPIM- BSCM (Basics of Supply Chain Management): 3 credit hours associate & bachelor's degrees
- CPIM DSP (Detailed Scheduling and Planning): 2 credit hours bachelor's degree
- CPIM ECO (Execution and Control of Operations): 2 credit hours bachelor's degree
- CPIM MPR (Master Planning of Resources): 2 credit hours bachelor's degree
- CPIM SMR (Strategic Management of Resources): 3 credit hours bachelor's degree
- CSCP (Certified Supply Chain Professional): 3 credit hours bachelor's degree
